

Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends

This edition of our magazine covers 3 great seasons of the Christian year, Advent, Christmas and Epiphany. These are the seasons of REJOICING, RECEIVING, REVEALING.

The Advent Carol, O come, O come Emmanuel is the carol of Rejoicing and has the words, "O come thou dayspring, come and cheer our spirits by thine advent here; disperse the gloomy clouds of night, and death's dark shadows put to flight; Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel".

We need this message for our world and for ourselves. The ongoing situation in Ukraine and the financial worries we are experiencing fill us with the "gloomy clouds of night" but as Christians we have the Advent Hope. Jesus has come and will come again to bring us God's gift of love. His love comes through our families and friends.

No matter how lonely or distressed we may feel, God will not forsake us. This is the Advent Message and it comes true as we celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas – the ultimate gift of love.

The shepherds, the ordinary people of that time RECEIVED the good news of Jesus' birth and went to worship him. We too Receive. Not just presents, however pleasing that is, but the everlasting Present - Jesus.

The well- loved carol, In the Bleak Midwinter, has the words "What can I give him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd I would bring a lamb; If I were a wise man I would do my part; Yet what I can I give him, give my heart." Give as we have Received!

Epiphany is the REVEALING season. This is when Jesus is Revealed to the world beyond the Jewish faith. Jesus is Revealed as the nature of God himself. He shows us, reveals to us what God has to offer and what God wants for us and from us.

Our young children and grandchildren tell us what they want for Christmas and this is better than giving and receiving gifts that we don't really want or need (like the 27 pairs of socks I received one year!).

The Epiphany hymn, Brightest and Best concludes with the words, "Vainly we offer each ample oblation(gift), vainly with gifts would his favour secure; richer by far is the heart's adoration, dearer to God are the prayers of the poor". My we REJOICE, RECEIVE, REVEAL the true meaning of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany. And be thankful (even for 27 pairs of socks).





Where did the Wise Men come from?

Magi from the East – it isn't a lot to go on. The Magi had originally been a religious caste among the Persians. Their devotion to astrology, divination and the interpretation of dreams led to an extension in the meaning of the word, and by the first century the Magi in Matthew's gospel could have been astrologers from outside of Persia. Some scholars believe they might have come from what was then Arabia Felix, or as we would say today, southern Arabia.

It is true that in the first century astrology was practised there, and it was the region where the Queen of Sheba had lived. She of course had visited Solomon and would have heard the prophecies about how one day a Messiah would be born to the Israelites and become their king.

Matthew's gospel (chapter 2) is clear that the Magi asked Herod: 'Where is the One who has been born king of the Jews? We saw His star in the east and have come to worship Him.' So it is possible that in southern Arabia the Queen of Sheba's story of how a Messiah would one day be sent to the Israelites had survived. Certainly, there are a number of other early legends that connect southern Arabia with Solomon's Israel.

To many people this makes sense: that the ancient stories of a Messiah, linked to later astrological study, prompted these alert and god-fearing men to the realisation that something very stupendous was happening in Israel. They realised that after all these centuries, the King of the Jews, the Messiah, was about to be born.

One more interesting thing that gives weight to the theory that the Magi came from southern Arabia is this: if you study any map of Palestine as it was during biblical times, you will find that the old Arabian caravan routes all entered Palestine 'from the East'.

St. Mary's Christmas Appeal

This year, we will be collecting for Plant Dewi either with money or donations in kind for the Baby Bundle project. For those who are not familiar with what Plant Dewi is, here's a brief history:

In 1990 the DCSR began to focus on an area of work to meet the needs of children, young people and their families. A partnership with The Children's Society, a leading national charity, was established and a project known as the St Davids Community Development Team was created.

The team's brief was to work alongside children, young people and their families in their communities to establish facilities that improved the quality of their lives.

Community development techniques were successfully used to empower people to gain the skills and confidence to bring about a change in their lives for themselves.

Unexpectedly in 2001 and one year into a new five-year partnership agreement between the Diocese and The Children's Society, the latter decided to withdraw from all its activities in Wales.

The work of the team evidenced throughout the Diocese was immense and too valuable to lose, and therefore, the Council, under a TUPE transfer employed the project staff and renamed the team Plant Dewi.

Plant Dewi has now been operating in the Diocese for 20 years. Our local contact for the Baby Bundle Project is Wendy Evans from St. Peter's Church, Carmarthen.

The Baby Bundle Bank... in partnership with the Mothers' Union makes life a little easier for new or expectant young parents in need. Baby Bundle Bank provides essential resources and equipment to welcome a new baby into the family home, relieving young parents of the worry and anxiety of how they will be able to afford to provide them.

List of items needed for the Baby Bundle bank. We go up to age 2.

Babygros/vests/outfits – All sizes but mainly newborn and 0-3 mths. (Unisex is very useful for smaller sizes)

Baby Toiletries – not talc. (Low on wipes at the moment)

Nappies – all sizes but mainly NB/0-3mths/3-6mths.

New baby towels. Blankets and Knitted items – no "holy" patterns.

Sheets – Moses basket and cot sizes. Toys – cuddly toys must be brand new with labels.

Donations may be left at the back of church and money given to Brenda Evans or wardens.



December 4th Osmond – an immigrant before Brexit

Osmond is the saint for you if you regret Brexit, and believe that immigrants can bring good to Britain. Osmond came to England from France back in the days before EU regulations. It was shortly after 1066, and he was a Norman, following William the Conqueror.

Osmond himself was no soldier, but a gifted and godly man, with a great gift of administration. He became royal chaplain, and then chancellor in 1072, producing numerous royal letters and charters for the king. In 1078 he was made bishop of Salisbury. As such, he completed and consecrated the cathedral, and formed such an outstanding chapter and constitution that it later became a model for other English cathedrals.

Osmond took part in the preparation of the Domesday Book, and was present when it was presented to William in April 1086. He died in 1099, well respected for his purity and learning, and his lack of avarice and ambition.



Obituary

It is with sadness that we report news of the death of Mrs. Peggy Blackburn, 98 years old, known locally as 'Peggy the Forge'. Peggy until three years ago lived in the cottage by the castle arch, Castle Street, Kidwelly. She moved to Kendal, Cumbria in 2019 to be near her son. Her funeral has been held near Kendal on 26th October. It was her wish that her ashed be brought back to Kidwelly to be interred in the family grave at Capel Sul Cemetery. Condolences are extended to her daughter, Mrs. Susan Thomas, Suffolk, and her son, Mr. Andrew Blackburn, Kendal, Cumbria.

It is also with sadness that we report the death of Mrs Mattie David, née Evans, daughter of the late Glan and Territh Evans. Mattie died at the University Hospital of Wales, Cardiff on October 22nd 2022 aged 87 years. Mattie was educated at Queen Elizabeth Grammar School for Girls, Carmarthen and Swansea College where she trained as a teacher, following which she taught in Islington, London. After her marriage she moved to Llantwit Major where she became deputy headmistress at St. Illtyd's School in St. Athans RAF Camp until her retirement. As a young girl she excelled in music and at the age of 12 years won the pianoforte competition at the Welsh National Eisteddfod following which she was invited to play the piano on the BBC Radio programme called 'Ein Tre Ni'. Sincere sympathy is extended to her so, Brennig David and family, Hereford, Terry Evans, her brother in Newport and to her first cousin, Ieuan Hughes, Kidwelly. 

Campaign to tackle 'devasting' impact of Wales' cost of living crisis:

With more and more people struggling to make ends meet, the collective voice of the Church in Wales is best placed to advocate on their behalf.


"It is scandalous that foodbanks were only intended to be a short-term emergency service but have now become an essential part of everyday life for so many. I find it outrageous that as the sixth largest economy in the world, the UK has so many families struggling to pay for food and heating."

The Bevan Foundation's Snapshot on Poverty report found that between January and July this year 57 per cent of families in Wales cut back on heating, electricity and/or water, and 39 per cent cut back on food for adults.







Reflecting Faith – To the Glory of God. The Rev Dr Jo White continues her series:


Everything about the church building is intended to tell us something about God.

But it doesn't end there. We put into the building things that are important to us and again reflect not just our specific denomination but our ways of worship. Imagine visiting someone in their home whom you are just getting to know and have a look around at the decorations, photos, wall hangings, books, music etc. What are their hobbies? How do they enjoy spending their time? Who is important to them? Well our church interiors are like that.

In most church buildings each week there will be a display of flowers. Venues vary from being large and elaborate to simple and homely and so do such arrangements. Of course, much depends upon finance and the availability of flowers as well as the interest and skills of the arranger.

Flower arrangements 'should' be in keeping with the church season or the occasion that is being celebrated. During Advent (Latin meaning 'coming') while we anticipate the birth of Christ at the Feast of Christmas most places of worship show restraint in their arrangements and often decline to use any coloured flowers using only evergreen leaves.

Then nearer to Christmas itself everything changes and either flowers are added to the original evergreens or they start completely new. Colours change to red for love and Christ's death and passion, white and gold for importance, royalty and celebration: with green alongside for the hope of new birth and spring. This month: Have a look at the flowers used in a church near you. What do they 'say'? Perhaps there will be poinsettias, lilies or even irises. Each has a different story to tell of the glory of God.
