

Dear Friends,

The Day of Pentecost is almost upon us and may have even been and gone by the time you read this message. For the majority of Christians, Pentecost is known as the “Birthday of the Christian Church”. The Greek word for “church” is *ekklesia*, and in Scripture, it simply means a group of people called out for a purpose. In its 89 uses in the epistles written to Christians, it refers either to individual groups of Christian believers or to all Christians as a body.

In the Old Testament, Pentecost was one of the major Jewish feasts that occurred annually as per God’s directive for His people. These holidays were designed to keep God in people’s minds and to promote national unity. Pentecost was also called the “Feast of Weeks,” the “Feast of Harvest,” or the “Feast of Firstfruits,” and was held on the 50th day after Passover.

The Four Gospels basically end with Jesus’ ascension (Luke 24:51-53). If we then go to the book of Acts, we join the timeline with that same event in Chapter 1, verse 9, after which his disciples chose a replacement for Judas, who had committed suicide. And then comes Chapter 2, which begins as follows:

Acts 2:1-4

- (1) “When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place.
- (2) Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting.
- (3) They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them.
- (4) All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.”

Pentecost is a happy festival. Ministers in church often wear robes with red in the design as a symbol of the flames in which the Holy Spirit came to earth as tongues of fire above the heads of each disciple. Many Christians celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit in worship activities on Pentecost, or as it is sometimes called, **Whitsunday**. This name is said to arise from the ancient practice of newly baptized individuals wearing white robes during this time. In the Christian liturgical year, Pentecost is the seventh Sunday after Easter and closes the Easter season.

You might be thinking, “That’s all very interesting, but why is Pentecost *important*?” It’s important because it infused the small community of Jesus-followers with the core mission that would define the Christian church ever after: to share the message of Jesus Christ with the entire world.

Consider that in the weeks following Christ’s death and resurrection, many of his followers were undoubtedly still processing the incredible events they had witnessed, and were probably wondering what God wanted them to do now that Jesus had carried out his mission. On Pentecost, God made it clear what Christ-followers should do with the news of Jesus Christ: share it with others. And not

just with the Jewish communities in which they lived; the multi-linguistic nature of this miracle made it plain that the Gospel message was not confined to one community, nation, ethnicity, or language. Pentecost is when the Christian church received, and was empowered to carry out, its grand assignment of evangelism. The mission given to Christians on Pentecost still stands, thousands of years later. We are to share the saving message of Jesus Christ with the world—and as we do so, we should rely on the presence of the Holy Spirit, who empowered the early church to share the gospel, and continues to do so today. The Easter season is winding down. We have marked the Church's feast of the Ascension and soon Pentecost, which honours the coming of the Spirit, will be here. Then, after 50 days of having the opportunity to celebrate Easter faith, to live Easter hope, to share Easter joy, the Liturgical Year will cycle us back into Ordinary Time. However, the opportunities to celebrate faith, live hope, and share joy will be ever present. We will do this at our Baptism services and Weddings, also our organ recitals, folk music festival and all other occasions when we gather socially and faithfully. And in those opportunities, we will have the chance to celebrate the Spirit—the fullness of God's presence and love with us and in us. Happy Birthday Christians Everywhere! It's Pentecost! Ty-Golau at Kidwelly is going from strength to strength and the Morfa chapel vestry is packed every Wednesday morning. We are concerned that due to the recent increase in numbers, we may have to look for a new venue in the very near future. An outline of a typical session is as follows-

1. Welcome---Tea/ coffee/ hot chocolate and cakes.

2. Reality orientation -Reminder of place, day, date, season and weather.

3. Memory Tray/ Memory quiz. 8-10 items on a tray are shown and discussed. The items are then covered and put aside and the group are asked how many they can remember at the end of the session.

4. Main topic (with power point to reinforce the spoken word).

For example - 29th March. Mother's Day (Famous Mothers).

5th April. Easter Celebration. **26th April.** All things English (St. George's

Day) **3rd May.** The Old School Room. **10th May.** The Old Sweet Shop.

The hall is decorated to suit the topic, themed songs are sung and volunteers often dress up for the occasion e.g. Pearly Queen for St. George's Day (see pic.)

5. Ty-Golau song ('God be with you 'till we meet again').

6. Short prayer of blessing.

Ty-Golau is not just a social group. The aim of each session is to provide specialist care with interesting and stimulating activities for the brain which are delivered in an appropriate and FUN way.

Carers/family members are warmly welcomed to attend and report that they enjoy the group as much as the person they accompany to the session. Others may prefer to leave the person they care for in the group and take time for respite, in the knowledge that they are safe, well looked after and having a good time.
