

Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends,

Just recently, I was surprised by an item on the BBC News about my home town of Barrow-in-Furness. Unfortunately, there was nothing good about this news item as it was telling us that there is a serious drug problem in Barrow and twelve people have died in recent times. There were interviews with the Police, Town Council officials and some of the addicts. It didn't paint a pretty picture of the town. If you had seen this news item before I came here and then heard that your next Priest-in-Charge came from a town in the far north of England with a major drug problem you may have wondered if you really wanted me. You may have thought can anything good come from this Barrow-in-Furness!

On the first of May we remember the Apostles Philip & James. It was Philip who introduced his friend Nathanael to Jesus, but when Philip first told Nathanael that Jesus was from the Northern town of Nazareth his response was "Can any good thing come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see."

Philip had experienced an encounter with Jesus, and he wanted to share it, because he knew how important and life changing his encounter had been. Philip felt an urgent need to tell his friend Nathanael, because he wanted Nathanael to experience an encounter with Jesus too.. He found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote--Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." "Nazareth? Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Nathanael asked. Philip was not put off by his friend's remark. He didn't try counter with a clever response, his reply was a simple, "Come and see.". Nathanael, seems to have taken this as a challenge and went along with Philip to judge this Jesus for himself. Nathaniel being genuinely wanting to seek the truth found it embodied in that first encounter.

Nathaniel became a follower of Jesus, and that is how the good news of Jesus is spread. Friends telling friends, but we often avoid talking about Jesus amongst our non-Christian friends in case we upset them, or they upset us and then we feel uncomfortable with each other and we wouldn't want that would we?

Except that is exactly how the word of our Lord was first spread, The Apostles and the early evangelists went about talking first to their families and friends and then to complete strangers, because they felt that they had a commission from their Lord, to go out and tell the world about the Good News of Salvation. They had seen it won through the life, teaching, healing, Salvation work of Jesus Christ, hard won for us on the Cross and then ensured by his resurrection.

Good News like that is too good to keep to ourselves. The TV and the newspapers are full of bad news. Bad news sells papers and gets people talking, but so can good news if the power of that good message is lived out and made alive so that others can feel it for themselves. The world desperately needs the Good News of Salvation. That is what the word "Gospel" means, it means Good News. It is the BEST NEWS! It is the promise of forgiveness and Eternal Life!

So during May, let's make a special effort to do our bit to be agents of the Good News of Christ and like Philip, let's invite others to "Come and see".

The Archdeacon will be visiting the LMA on Monday 14th May.

PCC – There will be a PCC meeting on **Wednesday 16th May** at 7.00pm in the Parish Room. This will be to discuss matters arising from the Archdeacon's visit on Monday 14th May with regard to the transition of the Local Ministry Area.

Annual Vestry report – Monday April 16th

Pleasing improvement in attendance but it would be good to see even more interest in what the church's AGM.

Parish Reports – Owing to extenuating circumstances, the Financial Report will be presented at another meeting. Mr. Edwin Atkinson wish to place on record gratitude for the wonderful work done by Mr Glyn Evans and also Brenda and Dorian's work in filling the gap.

Churchwardens of St. Mary's and St. Teilo had nothing specific to report.

Vicar's Report Vicar took us through significant services in the church year. In August, at a Carmarthen Deanery meeting, changes were introduced to the LMA. Cunedda LMA will have another four churches added so there is a need to know the future Ministry Team.

There are 100 benefices in the Diocese that will be amalgamated into 22/23 LMA's.

The Bishop set limits to the number of Sunday services that a stipendiary cleric can take and retired clergy can fill in only in cases of emergency, holidays, sickness or sabbaticals.

Vicar recorded his thanks to officials and to the Revd. Roger Morley-Jones and his appreciation of the wonderful music that the late Hazel and David had brought to Kidwelly. He acknowledged the many years of Glyn's service as our Treasurer.

Messy Church/Sunday School This continues well but with fluctuations in attendance. Posters available to advertise the next one. Numbers low at Sunday School apart from a wonderful 15 at Easter. Attendance seems to depend on other events that families are involved in.

Wardens & PCC No change to Vicar's or People's Wardens for St. Mary's and St. Teilo.

The list of nominations from the back of church for PCC members was elected. The PCC remains the same with the addition of Mrs. Jeanette Gilasbey. An auditor will be appointed once the accounts are ready.

PCC meeting that followed The new Treasurer, Diane Cuff and existing Secretary Kath Nicholas were co-opted in their positions.

When the LMA becomes a Deanery, Trevor has the offer of being Area Dean. As this leads to further questions about the LMA in future, a set of questions was compiled by the PCC to send to the Archdeacon in advance of his meeting with church representatives on May 14th when he plans to visit all 10 churches in the LMA!

At the previous PCC meeting on March 14th the parish room was the main point of discussion. The kitchen needs rebuilding re-using the stone with an inner skin. Total works estimated at £50,000 including VAT. This price includes a new ceiling, heating, improved insulation and toilet. Will need to apply for grants and considerable fund-raising will be needed. We have to go ahead with the plans.

At this meeting we were pleased to accept Diane Cuff as the new Treasurer and Edwin Atkinson would be the Assistant. As Diane, from Ferryside, was new to some PCC members, she gave a brief resumé of her experience as a treasurer and company secretary.

Brenda gave her thanks for donations in Glyn's memory: £1,095 for St. Mary's and £960 to MacMillan. Nevin had thanked the family of Mrs. Enid Walters for the donation to buy something for St. Teilo.

At the April 16th meeting questions were raised as to the progress of the Parish Room. Application has been made for a Co-op Community fund grant. Building surveyors estimate ¾ weeks for spec. then can go out to tender. Little will happen until mid-summer then parish room will be out of action. More grant aid and fundraising to be considered.





A small group enjoyed a coffee morning at Parc Y Bocs, courtesy of Burns in the Community. This month we had Deborah & Tracey from Llanelli Fire Community Safety Team who gave us a preventative talk on the importance of smoke & carbon monoxide alarms, unplugging appliances when not in use and especially overnight. They also advised us that anyone can contact them for a free fire safety check in the home. We also had Wayne & Sarah, PCSO's, who, although Kidwelly police station is closed, patrol us from their base in Burry Port. They advised us that there is a telephone scam doing the rounds at the moment. People are being told the call is from the Tax Office and they owe

money. This is a SCAM. Do not pay anything. Hang up and report it on 101. Also if junk mail is received asking for money, report it. We then had a brief talk from Lenny from Burns Garden & Home Maintenance project. He offers gardening services, window, gutter & fascia cleaning. He also mentors youngsters who work alongside him, helping them to obtain skills in the workplace, and who are then able to proceed to full employment.
