

Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends.

We are told that life today is now more stressful than ever before; various surveys have shown that for many people levels of stress and anxiety are at record levels. The sources of our worry can be many and varied: they may be financial; related to our health; we may have concerns about family members or friends; jobs, school, housing, even the news can all bring worry.

Unfortunately, stress is part of life and while some have more to worry about than others, we will all feel the pressure of life at some time. With all the things that are happening in our local ministry area and the wider diocese, those of us involved in church affairs are under particular stress at the moment. Some of this is fear of the unknown, some of it the lack of an ability to see the 'light at the end of the tunnel' so to speak. In the case of the church, the ever-present issues of maintenance and finance will be causing a certain amount of restlessness.

How do we deal with this then? There is much in scripture that can bring comfort. The well-known passage from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians is often quoted when times are hard. "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."

It is important to remember that prayer changes things; our God is always listening to us and our prayers will be answered although, not always in the way that we may expect or even want. But, prayer can change us: it allows us to voice our fears and make our petitions to the one who loves us all unconditionally. It is said that a problem shared is a problem halved and I would always urge people to share their burdens with the Almighty as he is the one who always listen and will never judge us. There is no wrong way to pray, no special words are needed, no complicated posture just open our hearts and give voice (silently or out loud) to our concerns. But to do this we need to stop and take a break. Prayer is not just asking, it is listening as well. It is spending time, even a minute in silence.

We can also find support in worship. You do not have to be 'a church person' (whatever that is) to come to church. Everyone is welcome, you do not have to participate in anything if you don't want to, just sit and let it all wash over you. I can't guarantee an instant transformation, but I can assure you that peace and healing for body, mind and soul can be found in the company of others at prayer and worship.



She had a preference for working behind the scenes as was evident when there were Flower Festivals in St. Mary's when she would make sure that arrangers had regular refreshments.



Diocesan and World wide Elections




Royal British Legion

As I write we have just started our Indian summer, so I hope it's still here as you read this! Our speakers for this month were Helen & Kelly from TeTrim Teas. A surprise for most of us, as the tea was made from either Rhubarb root or mushrooms. These teas have been developed to be gut kind, and that works with your body to improve wellbeing. Some of the trials were carried out at Trimsaran, alongside research at Aberystwyth University. The rhubarb tea is to be drunk after your evening meal and when you have finished eating for the day. It is cleansing for body and mind. The Mushroom tea has 2 flavours, Welsh Heritage Apples & Cinnamon, and the other includes Ginger & Chilli and another ingredient that I can't remember. Oops! These are Brightening Teas, to be had in the mornings and help you through the day. We had some mixed reactions. The research into these Teas has been extensive, and wherever possible the ingredients are sourced in Wales. They have even instigated the growing of green tea over here. In Trimsaran, they are now growing the mushrooms. All in all, it is a very environmental, ethical, and organic company. As local as possible, as Welsh as

Remembering Desmond Tutu T*im Lenton remembers a much-loved Bishop.* Forty years ago, on 16th October 1984, the South African Anglican Bishop, Desmond Tutu won the 1984 Nobel Peace Prize for his role in the opposition to apartheid.

Born into a Methodist family in Transvaal in 1931, Tutu went first into teaching, but after three years retired in protest at the deteriorating standard of black education, in particular the discriminatory Bantu Education Act of 1953. Instead, he went into the church, enrolling at St Peter's Theological College in Johannesburg and becoming an Anglican priest, then studying theology at King's College, London.

In 1975 he became the first black person to hold the position of Dean of St Mary's Cathedral in Johannesburg, following this by becoming Bishop of Lesotho and then in 1978 the first black General Secretary of the South African Council of Churches.

Regarded by many as a prophet in the liberation theology sense of the word – someone challenging power – Tutu became Archbishop of Cape Town in 1986, therefore the leader of South Africa's 1.6 million Anglicans. Always a pacifist, he was already one of the most prominent voices calling for sanctions on the apartheid regime from the international community.

On the release of Nelson Mandela from prison in 1990 after 27 years, when South Africa moved towards democracy, he saw his country as "The Rainbow Nation". Mandela responded by making him Chairman of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission in 1995.

Exhilarated by a new vision for the future of South Africa, he described himself as "on cloud nine" when the election results came in 1994. He planned the religious component of Mandela's inauguration ceremony, including Jewish, Muslim and Hindu leaders.

Tutu's Nobel Prize medal was stolen in June 2007 from his home in Johannesburg, but was recovered a week later.

God in the arts -'Glorious the song when God's the theme' 'The Dream of Gerontius'

Editor: The Revd Michael Burgess continues his series looking at great works of music.

John Henry Newman was a great Victorian churchman, an inspired Anglican preacher and teacher who became a Roman Catholic in 1845. Newman was also a poet and wrote hymns that have remained perennial favourites – among them, 'Lead, kindly Light 'and 'Praise to the Holiest.'

The first hymn was written when, as an Anglican, Newman was ill in Sicily and his servant thought he might die. He recovered and, anxious to return home, he wrote these words, knowing that God had important work for him to do. The light that he prayed for in Sicily was to shine out, resplendent and glorious, in that later hymn which expresses the vision of the heavenly courts in the longer poem, 'The Dream of Gerontius.'

Newman wrote the poem in 1865 after the death of a 41-year-old fellow Oratorian, Fr John Joseph Gordon, who had said to him as he lay dying, "I do not say that I do not fear to die: for death must always be a fearful thing. God's justice is very terrible; but then, in the crucifixion, God's mercy appears so very great." 'The Dream of Gerontius' is about death and judgement, but it is the judgement of a loving God.

Newman presented Dvorak with a copy of this poem when the composer visited Birmingham, and he was invited to compose a setting for the city's 1888 Festival. Although Dvorak felt inspired by the words, the timescale was too demanding. The poem was presented to Elgar on his wedding day a year later, again with the suggestion that he set it to music. The words simmered and stirred in Elgar's imagination to produce one of the great oratorios of all time in 1900, when it was given its first performance in Birmingham.

Elgar inscribed the score ADMG (To the greater glory of God) and wrote on the last page of the manuscript, 'This is the best of me.' The light of God's glory and grace that inspired Newman shines through the music as it shone through Elgar's own life. His funeral card of 1934 contained words from the poem, and on his own score of 'The Dream' he wrote these words of Virgil, 'Whence doth so dear desire of Light on wretches grow?'

It is now difficult to separate the poem from Elgar's setting. The composer, like the poet, leads the listener from the prayer of faith, 'Firmly I believe and truly' – a prayer sustained by the words of the priest, 'Go forth upon thy journey, Christian soul' – to the judgement throne where the angels praise God in the heights.

One of the angels then leads the soul away with a beautiful setting of 'Softly and gently,' not to the fire of judgement, but to the cleansing, sustaining water of eternal life. The work ends with echoes of that angelic hymn, praising God who is our refuge in every generation.

Newman wrote, "I always sleep better after music." He compared music to an electric current that passes through the body and then into the mind and heart. And Elgar's wonderful setting can do exactly that, creating a vision of that new world of eternal glory that Gerontius expresses in the words, "Novissima hora est......into thy hands, O Lord, into thy hands."



October 6th -William Tyndale Bible translator and Reformation martyr.

This month is the 501th anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation, and so a good time to pay tribute to an outstanding English scholar, translator and martyr of the Reformation.

William Tyndale (c. $1494 - 6^{th}$ October 1536) was born near Gloucester, and studied at Oxford and Cambridge. He could speak seven languages, and was proficient in ancient Hebrew and Greek. As a priest, his abilities would have taken him a long way, but by 1523 Tyndale's only desire was to translate the Bible, so that English men and women could read it for themselves. It became his life's passion.

For Tyndale had rediscovered a vital doctrine that the Church had been ignoring: that of justification by faith. He had found it when reading Erasmus's Greek edition of the New Testament. In fact, his life's work was well summed up in some words of his mentor, Erasmus: "Christ desires His mysteries to be published abroad as widely as possible. I would that [the Gospels and the epistles of Paul] were translated into all languages, of all Christian people, and that they might be read and known."

Tyndale's translation was the first Bible to be published in English, the first to draw directly from Hebrew and Greek texts, and the first English translation to take advantage of the printing press.

It was to cost him his life. For Tyndale's work was seen as a direct challenge to the power of both the Roman Catholic Church and the laws of England in maintaining the Church's position.

When the authorities tried to stop his translation, Tyndale fled to Hamburg, Wittenberg, Cologne, and finally to the Lutheran city of Worms. It was there, in 1525, his New Testament emerged. It was quickly smuggled into England, and King Henry VIII, Cardinal Wolsey, and others, were furious.

Tyndale moved on to Antwerp, where for nine more years he continued his work. Then in May 1535 he was betrayed, arrested, and jailed in a castle near Brussels. Tied to the stake for strangulation and burning, his dying prayer was that the King of England's eyes would be opened. Sure enough, two years later King Henry authorised the Great Bible for the Church of England, which relied largely on Tyndale's work.

Not only that, but in 1611, the 54 scholars who produced the King James Bible drew very heavily from Tyndale. Even today we honour him: in 2002, Tyndale was placed at number 26 in the BBC's poll of 100 Greatest Britons.

The story behind Come ye Thankful People Come

Come, ye thankful people, come, Raise the song of harvest home! All is safely gathered in, Ere the winter storms begin;< God, our maker, doth provide For our wants to be supplied; Come to God's own temple, come; Raise the song of harvest home!

We ourselves are God's own field, Fruit unto his praise to yield; Wheat and tares together sown, Unto joy or sorrow grown; First the blade and then the ear, Then the full corn shall appear: Grant, O harvest Lord, that we Wholesome grain and pure may be.... By H Alford (1810 – 71)

Very probably, you will sing this well-loved Harvest hymn this month. It was written by the Revd Henry Aldford, DD, a Victorian clergyman who had been a fellow student at Trinity College, Cambridge with Alfred Tennyson, and whose transparent goodness and friendliness seem to have made him liked and appreciated wherever he went.

His ministry began as vicar of Wymeswold, a tiny village in Leicestershire with a badly neglected church. Over 18 years, Henry rebuilt the faltering Christian community, faithfully visiting every person in his parish, and preaching his way through the Bible in sermons that were so clear that everyone could understand him. He then moved on to the incumbency of Quebec Chapel in London for four years, before moving to the Deanery of Canterbury, in 1857, where he lived until his death in early 1871.

Henry was one of life's good people; gentle, kindly, grateful for everything he had (he used to say 'grace' before AND after each meal), and eager to encourage all those whom he served. He was prodigiously productive: writing something like 50 books. The best known of these was a four-volume exposition of the New Testament, which took him nearly 20 years.

His famous hymn draws upon two of Jesus' parables: the story of the wheat and tares (Mt 13:24-30) and the story of the seed that grows unbeknown to the sower (Mark 4:26-29). Both are parables drawn from agriculture; both are about the ultimate harvest of our souls before God.

During this lifetime we properly give thanks to God for our harvest of His gifts of creation, but we should also reflect on what seed we are sowing in our lives, and what harvest we may expect as one day God will gather together *only His own* for the eternal heavenly harvest.


