

#### **Pastoral Letter**

#### Dear Friends,

It seems a little odd to be writing this letter to cover a two-month period that encompasses three seasons of the church's year, Advent, Christmas and Epiphany. If you include the time when I am writing it you can add a fourth, the Kingdom season as well. Some of the seasons of the church's year are fairly easy to understand. We all know about Christmas, most people understand that Advent is the weeks that lead up to Christmas even if they don't understand the reflective, solemn and penitential nature of Advent itself.

But what of Epiphany? If any of you are familiar with the Adrian Mole books by Sue Townsend, you may recall the passage when the 13 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> year old protagonist wondered why the word Epiphany appeared printed in his diary. When he discovered what it meant he wrote an entry which read, "Something to do with the three wise men – big deal"...

As it happens Epiphany is a 'big deal'. Whilst I won't go into the deeper theological thought behind it, the visit of the wise men to the infant Jesus is the point that his divinity is revealed to people outside of his circle and outside of his religion. Jesus was a Jew, and the Jewish people had been waiting for a messiah to come for them for thousands of years, they thought that the Messiah was just for them. The arrival of the wise men and their realisation that Jesus was the son of God, the Messiah and saviour of the whole of humankind and not just a small part of it was an earth-shattering revelation.

In Advent we prepare, we look at ourselves with all our faults. We might even consider that we are not worthy of the love of the coming Christ child. At Christmas we celebrate His great arrival, not with pomp and splendour, but humbly. With Epiphany we can realise what it is that we have really received. We are not worthy of Christ's love, but he freely gives it to us none the less.

In the midst of all the busyness, we need to make time for ourselves and spend time in the presence of our maker. It will do us all a lot of good. There is plenty happening in your churches, including a special service for people who find this time of year hard. Please don't forget, Christ came for all, St. Mary's, St. Teilo's and St. Maelog's are there for all, whether you come every week or haven't darkened the doors for 60 years.

I wish you all a peaceful Advent, a Joyful Christmas, and a revealing Epiphany, full of Christ's love and grace.

Thanks to those who brought their yellow boxes in. We raised £211.55 which will be sent to Plant Dewi for their valuable work in the Diocese.







#### Christmas message from Cllr Carl Peters-Bond, Mayor of Kidwelly:

Christmas is a time of giving and spending time with friends and loved ones. That is something that the people of Kidwelly do so well all year-round. As your town mayor it has been so rewarding to be a small part of the many volunteer groups who are the beating heart of the town.

It has been a tremendous year for events in Kidwelly and Mynyddygarreg – from the spectacular Christmas light switch on and summer carnival organised by the Welfare Committee, to Mynyddygarreg Hall's beer festival, concerts and Eisteddfod. Our town's award-winning monthly market continues to go from strength to strength held on the first Saturday of each month at Glan yr Afon in the Summer and in the Princess Gwenllian Centre during the winter months.

#### Where did Christmas stockings come from?

No one is really sure, but a story is told of St Nicholas, a bishop who lived in the 4<sup>th</sup> century, who may have started the custom by accident. St Nicholas was of a wealthy family, and of a generous heart. As Christmas approached one year, he wanted to help a poor family whom he knew, but he did not want them to know it was him. So he climbed up on their roof on Christmas Eve and dropped some coins down the chimney.

The next morning the coins, to the great surprise of the family, were found in the stockings of the ladies, who had hung them to dry by the fire the night before. Every year after that they put their stockings out, in the hope that some more money would fall into them. They told the story of this amazing appearance to their friends and neighbours, and the custom caught on.

#### White and purple ribbon for No More 1 in 3



#### 4th December Osmond – an immigrant before Brexit


Osmond is the saint for you if you regret Brexit and believe that immigrants can bring good to Britain. Osmond came to England from France back in the days before EU regulations. It was shortly after 1066, and he was a Norman, following William the Conqueror.

Osmond himself was no soldier, but a gifted and godly man, with a great talent for administration. He became royal chaplain, and then chancellor in 1072, producing numerous royal letters and charters for the king. In 1078 he was made bishop of Salisbury. As such, he completed and consecrated the cathedral, and formed such an outstanding chapter and constitution that it later became a model for other English cathedrals.

Osmond took part in the preparation of the Domesday Book and was present when it was presented to William in April 1086. He died in 1099, well-respected for his purity and learning, and his lack of avarice and ambition.







## Hedgehog extinction fears grow as population plummets

The status of hedgehogs in western Europe has recently been downgraded to "near threatened", according to the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List.

If European numbers decline any farther, hedgehogs will be listed as being at risk of extinction. Numbers have shrunk in more than half the countries where hedgehogs live – including the UK, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Belgium, the Netherlands, Germany and Austria. Some national declines have been as much as 33 per cent.

Our rural population of hedgehogs here in the UK has fallen by up to 75 per cent since 2000, although city-dwelling hedgehogs are doing a bit better.

But the combined pressures of intensive agriculture, domestic pesticides, garden strimmers, busy roads and urban development have taken their toll. An eighth of all hedgehogs in the UK die every year just as roadkill.

Now a national hedgehog conservation strategy has been launched by the People's Trust for Endangered Species (PTES) and the British Hedgehog Preservation Society (BHPS).

Have you seen any hedgehogs? How can we help them to survive the winter?





## **Restoring Welsh Rivers Summit**

The crisis facing Waless' rivers was the focus of a recent national summit hosted by the Church in Wales.

More than 70 people from across the UK, including scientists, farmers, environmentalists and water industry representatives discussed the challenges facing watercourses in Wales and to look at ways of improving water quality. The Restoring Welsh Rivers summit, chaired by the Archbishop of Wales, took place in Cardiff, just before the UN Climate Change Conference (COP29) and Wales Climate Week.

Key themes included an overview of the latest scientific data, the state of water quality, the impact of sewage, soil and agriculture on rivers, the effect on the food chain and the possibility of nature-based solutions.

The Archbishop, Andrew John, said, "Our rivers in Wales are dying because they are being polluted. Wildlife is declining and many of our own water-based activities, such as swimming, fishing and surfing, are increasingly unsafe. We need to respond urgently and that is why the Church in Wales has brought together key people with expertise or interest in the issue."

James Wallace, CEO of River Action UK, said, "We are delighted to see leadership from a key figure in Wales, the Archbishop. It is essential that we work together to agree a plan for the most effective and rapid ways of healing Welsh rivers, while ensuring the provision of essential services like sewage and water, and the livelihoods of farmers." #### **Vestry Cupboard that hid 'precious' Welsh Bible** (Parish Pump)

A Bible printed in 1620, one of the very first to be produced in Welsh, has been discovered by chance in a vestry cupboard in St Martin and St Enfail's Church in Merthyr.

Mari James, Library Development Officer at St David's Cathedral, described the 400-year-old Bible as "quite a treasure" and "a precious part of Wales' history of Christian worship".

A former Merthyr churchwarden, Huw Evans, found the Bible forgotten and unrecognised among candles, communion wine and linen in the back of the cupboard.

Copies of the Bible, known as the Bishop Parry version, were distributed to all churches in Wales to comply with Queen Elizabeth I's instruction that everyone should be able to read the Scriptures in their own language. This was the main Reformation project in Wales, intended to consolidate Protestantism.

The volume was based on the 1588 translation by Bishop William Morgan. The Old Testament was translated directly from the original Hebrew, and the New Testament from Greek. Some of the work was carried out in St David's.

A Welsh Book of Common Prayer, dating from 1710 in the reign of Queen Anne, was also found languishing – in the same vestry cupboard.

## January 6<sup>th</sup> – What about the gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh?

The story of the coming of the Magi grew in the telling. By the 6<sup>th</sup> century they had acquired names: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. By medieval times they were considered to be kings. Whoever they were, we do know from Matthew that they brought three gifts to Jesus.

What about their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh? While we cannot know for sure what was in the minds of first century Magi, one Victorian scholar has offered a possible explanation as to the significance of their gifts. He was the Rev John Henry Hopkins, an American Episcopalian minister, who in 1857 wrote his much-loved Christmas carol, 'We Three Kings of Orient Are'.

Gold, said John Henry Hopkins, was a gift that would have been given to a king. Frankincense had traditionally been brought by priests as they worshipped God in the Temple. Myrrh was a spice that the ancients used in preparing bodies for burial.

If that is true, then you could say that the Wise Men, in choosing their gifts for this infant, honoured Jesus with gold because He was King of the Jews, with frankincense because He was to be worshipped as divine, and with myrrh, because He would also become a sacrifice and die for His people.

The Wise Men were the very first gentiles ever to worship Jesus. What faith they had! They travelled for months over difficult terrain, they never saw any evidence of Jesus' kingship, His divinity or His sacrificial death. They worshipped Him through faith in God's promises about Him. Isaiah foresaw this response to Jesus: 'Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.' The Magi's eyes of faith saw clearly and far into the future.

Compare that with the High Priest and religious leaders whom the Wise Men saw in Jerusalem when they first arrived. These head priests knew all about the prophecies of their own coming Messiah, but NOT ONE Jewish religious leader travelled to look for Him in Bethlehem. And it is only six miles down the road!
