Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends,

If you have not yet taken down your decorations for Christmas, you will not be alone. For some of our brothers and sisters in Christ, notably those from the Orthodox traditions of the east, Christmas decorations remain up through the season of Epiphany and only come down at Candlemas. The date for this is always the 2nd of February and is 40 days after Christmas. I can see some sense in keeping decorations up until this point as January is never one of the brighter months and perhaps a few lights and a bit of tinsel left up during these damp and cold days could add a little much needed cheer.

The feast of Candlemas is one of those "We have heard of it, but what is it?" dates in the church calendar and I am sure that there are some clergy who have little idea what it actually celebrates. It marks the day that Christ was presented at the temple. Tradition was that this happened 40 days after birth and the child would be blessed and the mother would be ritually purified after giving birth. The event is recorded in Luke's gospel and the infant Jesus and his family meet Simeon and Anna, both elderly servants of the Temple who had given years of their lives to its worship. According to the Biblical account, the Holy Spirit came to Simeon and revealed to him that he would not die until he had seen the Christ of God. Upon taking Jesus into his arms, he uttered a prayer which we still use today, the beautiful Nunc Dimittis

Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace: according to thy word.

For mine eyes have seen thy salvation;

Which thou hast prepared before the face of all people;

To be a light to lighten the Gentiles and to be the glory of thy people Israel.

Simeon is known as the 'God recogniser': he was one of the first people to realise who the infant actually was and when it happened, he knew that his life was complete. He had seen and recognised the light of the world. This brings us back to Candlemas as there is a tradition that this is the day that people would bring their candles into the church to be blessed for the coming year. The hope being that whilst the candles defeated the darkness in the traditional sense, they would act as a reminder and encouragement to people to bring the light of Christ to places and people where the spiritual darkness caused pain and distress.

After Candlemas we enter into a few weeks of what is known liturgically as ordinary time. The colour green is seen in our churches and at this time it reminds us well that Spring is just around the corner and the first green shoots of the year are emerging to encourage us that warmer days and the brightness of new growth





May the sun shine always on your face:


May the wind be always at your back:

Give Direct & Updating your Gift Aid Declaration Form

Every three years we need to update our gift aid declaration forms to ensure we have the correct information regarding those who gift aid their weekly giving or annual donations. The new Declaration Forms will be available at the back of the church, from the vicar or church wardens. The form will be slightly different from previously in that it will now have Bro Cydweli LMA in the title. Now all gift aid claims to HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) across the LMA go through one central LMA account, however the money claimed is transferred into the respective churches' bank accounts once received.

Claiming Gift Aid is important to the finances of St Mary's, St Teilo's and St. Maelog's, as for every pound given, we get an extra 25p from HMRC which means donations go further – at no extra cost to the giver! All you need to do is sign our Declaration Form stating you are a UK Taxpayer. Please be sure to complete the form again even if we already have a form for you (unless it has been completed in the past year). Also, if you've never completed a form now is your chance to do so.

If you are giving via the Church in Wales Gift Direct scheme you do not need to complete the new Declaration Form unless you are also giving to our churches directly and we can claim Gift Aid. If you are not a UK Tax payer then Gift Aid can be claimed under the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme on any money you give, up to £30 a time, in our weekly open plate offering.

I would encourage you to take up the Give Direct Scheme as the Gift Aid is paid regularly into the church account.

Forms are the back of church. Please return your completed form by the end of March.



CHRISTMAS CHURCH-GOING IN WASHINGTON D.C. Mary Atkinson writes:

We had a wonderful stay in Washington with our daughter and family over the Christmas period, with two very different Church experiences. The first was at the Washington National Cathedral, construction of which began in 1907 and was completed 83 years later. President Theodore Roosevelt laid the first stone, and President George H.W. Bush the last. It was modelled on 14th century English gothic style and is built of stone without any use of steel. The only concession to modernity is under floor heating, bliss! The Cathedral receives no support from federal government or any Church body and is entirely reliant on donors.

The service we went to was a Live Nativity. It was a ticketed event; the Cathedral can accommodate up to 4,000 and every seat was sold. The Clergy had decorated their robes with gold wings and haloes, and there was a full pageant telling the Christmas story. A young couple from the regular congregation represented Joseph and Mary and processed up the main aisle with their new born baby (actually a girl, very modern!) and many others joined in playing the parts of shepherds and kings. The highlight for the children was the inclusion of a live donkey and a small flock of sheep! All the children were invited up to the front of the Cathedral so that they could see what was going on. We sang all the usual carols and hymns, but to very different tunes. On departure every family was given a bauble for their Christmas tree, with a profile of the Cathedral on it. A lovely memento for us.

The second service was very different but equally delightful. We walked from where we were staying through the very pretty streets of NW Washington, past clapboard fronted houses all with enormous wreaths on their front doors. We went to a Christmas Eve family communion service at the local Church, St. David's. It was beautifully but simply decorated with greenery and banks of pointsettia plants. Again, the Church was full, with lots of children all dressed in Christmas finery, American style! On chatting with the Vicar as we departed it transpired that the Church is affiliated to the St. David's Society; it has a full Welsh service once a year, and occasional bi-lingual services during the year. The Welsh flag was hanging proudly from the rafters.

History of Llandyfaelog Bells

Edwin Atkinson writes:

Hurrah: the restoration of the bells of St Maelogs is nearly complete. Many thanks for the considerable fund raising and to the Pilgrim Trust, Carmarthenshire Welsh Church Fund and Diocesan Repair Gund for their most welcome grants.

So, what is the bells' history. There were two bells in 1552 and the largest of today's bells dates back possibly to this time. But the present bellcote was not added to the church until 1825. This was initially a single bellcote but was rebuilt in 1872 to have three apertures, that is to take three bells. The structure is relatively unusual and is comparable to the multi-aperture bellcotes seen on the continent. This new bellcote and two new [i.e. additional] bells were made possible through the generosity of Richard Jennings of Gellideg who was also the principal benefactor towards the new roof, two stained glass windows, altar silver and school library.

These two smaller bells were cast in 1872 by Mears & Stainback of Whitechapel foundry in London. This closed in 2017 after 450 years of bell-making during which they manufactured the <u>Liberty Bell</u>, a famous symbol of <u>American independence</u>, and re-cast <u>Big Ben</u>. Our recent bell repair was undertaken by Taylors of Loughborough - Britain's last major bell foundry who had restored our large old bell in 1998.

Today's bells are "chimed" not swung. This means the bells are stationary but struck by a clapper that is in turn attached to a rope that comes down through the roof to where it is pulled by the bell ringer(s). It was the unexpected arrival of a fallen and broken clapper on the church path that alerted us to the need for repairs!

So now St Maelogs can again continue the ancient tradition of ringing its bells to call worshippers to church and for special events, weddings and funerals. We are very grateful to Taylors Bell Foundry, Peter Hayward (Diocesan Bell Adviser) and Eric Barnes-Green (Seion Church Repairers) and many others for their advice and help.





Where can family-minded birds raise their young these days? As our gardens and parklands become smaller and tidier, too many natural nest sites – such as holes in trees, old buildings and unkempt hedgerows – are rapidly disappearing

No wonder that our sparrows, greenfinches and swifts are in precipitous decline, and that one in four of our UK bird species are now under serious threat.

This makes it more important than ever to care for our remaining birds. By feeding, providing water and putting up nest boxes we can give them a safe space to raise their chicks.

The National Nest Box Week initiative encourages bird conservation across the UK, and it's easy to get involved, whether you're a teacher, part of a local wildlife group, or just wanting to boost the bird numbers in your own garden.

In praise of the humble egg

We love eggs. On average, we eat at least two of them each week, which makes eggs one of Britain's most popular foods.

Eggs are exceptionally good for you – high in protein, containing all the essential amino acids, rich in the B vitamins, vitamin D and A, and choline, and a source of healthy fats.

Eggs are also filling, and with 7.5g of protein in less than 80 calories per egg, there are few other foods that can match them for so much protein per gram. They are also inexpensive and easy to cook.

Experts recommend eating one or two eggs a day, and choosing a low-fat way of cooking them, by boiling or poaching. Cooking them in butter is a bit lower in fat than frying them in olive oil. Free-range eggs generally contain more vitamin D.

A perfectly cooked fluffy omelette is a lovely breakfast or quick dinner. Ellis Barrie shows you how to omelette in minutes, stuffed with cheese and spinach.

Shopping list

- Ingredients
- 2 knobs of **butter**: 2 knobs of butter
- large handful **spinach**: large handful spinach
- 2 free-range eggs: 2 free-range eggs
- 15g/½oz cheddar, grated: 15g/½oz cheddar, grated
- salt and freshly ground **black pepper** salt and freshly ground black pepper sep.
- Method
- 1. Melt a knob of butter in a frying pan placed over a medium heat. Add the spinach and cook for 1–2 minutes, until wilted. Season with salt and pepper. Tip out onto a plate and set aside.
- 2. In a bowl, beat the eggs until just mixed. Return the frying pan to a medium—high heat, add the remaining butter and melt until beginning to foam, then swirl it around the pan.
- 3. Pour in the beaten eggs, then tilt the pan to distribute the eggs evenly. Leave for 20 seconds, until the eggs begin to bubble.
- 4. Working quickly, use a spatula or wooden spoon to draw in the sides of the eggs to the centre, incorporating the butter. Gently shake the pan to redistribute the egg to the edges.
- 5. Sprinkle over the cheese and spinach while the egg is still slightly runny in the middle, then remove the pan from the heat. The residual heat will continue to cook the egg. Season with salt and pepper.
- 6. Using a spatula, fold one third of the omelette into the middle, then turn the omelette onto a warm plate folding over itself. Serve immediately.

Editor: Canon Paul Hardingham continues his series on the books of the Bible, which will run until the end of 2025.

What's the Big Idea? An Introduction to the Books of the Old Testament: Job

'Why does God allow suffering?' This is a frequently asked question of Christians, because we believe in a God who is both good and powerful and it is explored in the book of Job. This book is part of the wisdom literature, along with Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon.

Job was both wealthy and righteous, yet he experienced catastrophic suffering, losing all his wealth, children and health. This is portrayed as a result of Satan's challenge to God, testing whether Job's devotion to God was dependent on his circumstances or not.

The main body of the book (3:1-42:6) consists of dialogues between Job, his friends (Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar) and God. Job and his friends assume that God is almighty and just, and that no human being is wholly innocent. In the three cycles of speeches they wrestle with the reasons for Job's suffering, remembering his morally upright character.

Finally, all are silenced by God, as He speaks Himself (chs 38-42). He points out that Job knows very little about the universe when he reflects on God's power. Job confesses his lack of understanding and weakness, but then goes on to confess his confidence and trust in God. This puts suffering in a right perspective. Job is not condemned, and the book ends with the restoration of his family and possessions.

The importance of this book is that it realistically addresses the painful questions of life, without offering simplistic answers. It focuses on *how* we should respond to suffering, rather than on *why* God allows suffering: '*Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I shall depart. The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away; may the name of the LORD be praised.*'(1:21)
