

Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends.

I hope that you all had a joyful and safe summer. The days are now shortening, and rather unbearable temperatures are behind us. The church is celebrating the season of harvest or creation-tide as it is sometimes known and it is a time when we think not only of the harvest, but in more recent years we are called to look at and think about the natural world & environment.

The harvest festival is perhaps the best-known way that we celebrate this time of year, but there is more to it that just singing about ploughing the fields and scattering things. In our communities we are blessed to be surrounded by fields and farms. Many members of our congregations are directly or indirectly linked to food production commercially, some of us produce fruit and vegetables in our own gardens or may have allotments. However, in some areas of this country the sight of a field being harvested is not seen and people are further detached from what they eat: food comes from the supermarket all packed up and sterile with no thought to the sheer effort and risk that goes into it. We should never forget the toil of those who farm, process and distribute our food. I get a little fed up when I hear the generic word 'farmer' bandied about in the news, this is impersonal and whilst it is a description of a person who works in a major industry and is handy to use it at times, it makes no distinction between the large industrial producers and the small family farms that at times can struggle and in recent years have really felt the pinch and continue to do so. I find myself often thinking about farmers in the area that I know, the struggles that they face and the effort that they put in that at times reap little reward. They are not just 'the farmers', but they are Bill, Dai, Rhys, Ceris, Anne, Andrew, Beth, Elen, Llinos, Marc, Gill and many others without whose effort we would not eat

So much of what we hear about the environment is concerned with the natural world, but we need also to think about and pray for those who work in it. During our harvest festivals we will often pray for 'the farmers' and whilst it is right and proper that we do, we must remember that the farmers are Bill, Dai, Rhys, Ceris, Anne, Andrew, Beth, Elen, Llinos, Marc, Gill etc, people that have a name and are distinct individuals that toil in God's creation balancing stewardship of the land with the need to make a living.

We must also not forget that there is more to God's creation than the natural world. One of my favourite harvest hymns is "God of concrete,



Good wishes are extended to Deirdre Horsler as she begins her ordination training this month. We pray for her and Brian in this new journey in their lives.





Branch news A wonderful day out at the Cathedral on Mary Sumner Day August 9th





#### Your Favourite Recipe

This month, Canon Bryan Witt shares his mother's **Homemade Cordial**.



1 ½ pints cold water

Mince fruit into a large bowl. Stir in other ingredients. Stand for 24-48 hours. Strain into a bottle (or 2 bottles) Store in fridge and dilute to serve. If you want to get more out of your recipe follow the following instructions. Put strained peel into a pan with  $1\frac{1}{2}$  pts of water. Heat till warm and strain. Use undiluted within a few days.

#### A new Archbishop of Wales has been elected on 30 July 2025.

Cherry Vann who has served as the Bishop of Monmouth for the past five years, has been chosen as the 15th Archbishop of Wales.

She succeeds Bishop Andrew John who retired in July after three and a half years as the leader of the Church in Wales.

Archbishop Cherry was elected having secured a two-thirds majority vote from members of the Electoral College on the second day of its meeting at the St Pierre Church and Hotel in Chepstow. The election was confirmed by the other diocesan bishops and announced by the Senior Bishop, Bishop Gregory Cameron of St Asaph. Archbishop Cherry will be enthroned at Newport Cathedral in due course. As Archbishop she will continue to serve as Bishop of Monmouth.

Originally from Leicestershire, Archbishop Cherry Vann was consecrated as Bishop of Monmouth in 2020. Cherry was ordained as a deacon in 1989. She was then among the first women to be ordained as a priest in the Church of England in 1994. She then served as Archdeacon of Rochdale, in the Diocese of Manchester, for 11 years.

She said, "The first thing I shall need to do is to ensure that the issues which have been raised in the last six months are properly addressed and that I work to bring healing and reconciliation, and to build a really good level of trust across the Church and the communities the Church serves."



#### **Holy Cross Day**

On Holy Cross Day the Church celebrates the Cross as a symbol of triumph, as the sign of Christ's victory over death. Holy Cross Day goes right back to 14 September 335, and we have the mother of a Roman Emperor to thank for it.

Helena was a devout Christian, and after her son, Constantine, was converted, they agreed that she should travel from Rome to Israel, and seek out the places of special significance to Christians.

Of course, much of Jerusalem had been destroyed by the Romans around 135 AD. But even so, Helena finally located what she believed to be the sites of the Crucifixion and of the Burial (and modern archaeologists think she may well be correct). The sites were so close together that she built one large church over them – the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.

That church, built in honour of the Cross, was dedicated on 14 September 335.

The sign of the Cross has been used by Christians since early times. Tertullian, writing his *De Corona* (3:2) around AD 211, noted that Christians seldom did anything significant without making the sign of the cross.

What is its significance? Well, people often put their initials or some sort of personal mark on something to show that it belongs to them. The Cross is the personal mark of our Lord Jesus Christ, and we mark it on ourselves as a sign that we belong to him. Even in the book of Revelation, we read that the servants of God are 'sealed' or 'marked' on their foreheads as a sign that they are His.

A preacher once put it this way: if you were explaining to someone how to make a cross, you would say: "Draw an I." That is you standing before the Lord, saying, 'here I am'. Then cancel that vertical stroke with a horizontal stroke — as if to say: "Lord, I abandon my self-will and make you the centre of my life instead. I abandon myself to your love and service."

On Holy Cross Day, we recall Jesus' wonderful promise: "And when I am lifted up, I will draw all men unto me." (John 12:32)






#### ARTICLE FROM TŶ GOLAU

Jan is the first person to admit that she gained her award not just on her own merits but a result of the support of her volunteers and, of course, her husband, Bryan – everyone needs a Bryan, by the way -who is on the ball reminding Jan that she hasn't given housekeeping instructions yet! However, the award doesn't mean that all Jan's efforts are over. Not at all. There is more work to be done, more people to help, and Jan will be at the front of the line to accomplish more for her service users.

# Celebrating 200 years of public railroads

Two hundred years ago, on 27<sup>th</sup> September 1825, the world's first public railway opened. It was the Stockton and Darlington Railway in northeast England.

Inspired and supported by a prominent Quaker, Edward Pease, and backed financially by many Quakers nationally, it has been described as "the great theatre of railway operations", sparking the explosion of railways across the world and boosting the industrial revolution. About 20 miles of the original 25 mile stretch still exist, now as part of the Northern Rail line.

The technical expertise behind it all came from George Stephenson, an extraordinary self-taught engineer whose expertise, which originated in the mines, stretched beyond railways. His *Locomotion No 1*, built for the Stockton and Darlington line, was the first steam locomotive to carry passengers on a public rail line. He worked with his 18-year-old son Robert, who is known for creating the more famous *Rocket* four years later.

The first Stockton and Darlington train – which in fact ran from Old Etherley Colliery, some distance north of Darlington – was led by a man on horseback with a flag. The motto of the organising committee was "At private risk for public service".

With brakemen stationed between the wagons, the train reached 12 to 15mph and was greeted by an estimated 10,000 people at the Darlington junction, where some passengers left and more boarded. The average speed was calculated at about 8mph. Six wagons of coal were given to the poor by way of celebration.

A nine-month festival in County Durham and the Tees Valley – with artwork, spectacles and community events – is marking the bicentenary of the opening of the railway.

As a tribute to his life and achievements, a bronze statue of George Stephenson was unveiled at Chesterfield railway station in 2005. An earlier statue stands in Neville Street, Newcastle.
