

Pastoral Letter

Dear Friends,

We are very blessed that each of our three churches has a reasonable congregation. Don't get me wrong, it would be fantastic to see standing room only every week but compared to other churches in the diocese we are doing okay. Sadly, the statistics across Wales over recent years have not made good reading, church attendance is going down. However, there are signs that things are beginning to change. I don't think we are in the middle of the Great Welsh Revival 2025 but there are hints that perhaps change is on the way.

It is important to remember that the Church in Wales is underpinned by the parish system: this was part of what continued after disestablishment in 1920 (the split from the Church of England and the end of Wales having a national and official church). The reasons for disestablishment are too complex to go into now, the magazine is not long enough, but it probably wasn't the best thing to have occurred in the history of Welsh Christianity. The parish system means that each and every person who lives in an area is technically a member of the local Anglican church whether they like it or not. They may belong to other faiths or denominations, but they are part of the wider family of the church. Everyone who lives in the area around the church has a right to be baptised there, married there, have their funeral there and if there is room, be buried in the church yard. They also have a right to worship there.

Worshipping as a congregation is what underpins our faith. We can pray alone and indeed we should pray alone, but it is the coming together as a church family that really matters. It is what allows us to grow in faith, and with this faith comes hope and hope is something that is badly needed at times.

Our worship is where the natural and the supernatural meet; it is where we can be close to God, in the hymns, the prayers and the ritual. It is a time that allows us to acknowledge where we have failed and be assured that it doesn't matter as we are forgiven. It may be the only time in the week that we can find the peace to be ourselves, or even be honest with ourselves. Despite what some will tell you, a church service should be the original safe space. Do we worship to please God? Of course not. We worship to praise God, and to accept that we do not have all the answers.

Worship is where we can hand our problems over, perhaps only for an hour or so, but we hand them over none the less. Worship is where we can be honest and accept that we are not perfect and yet will not be judged for it.

It has been proved that attending church is good not only for the soul, but for the body and mind as well.



18th October is the feast day of St Luke, who is the patron saint of physicians. So this is a good month to pray for those in the NHS...

A&E nurses face an increasing barrage of punches, kicks and spitting – and having weapons aimed at them. One was even threatened with an acid attack.

The violence has been blamed on enforced long waits in A&E departments, corridor care, and chronic staffing problems.

The Royal College of Nursing reports that the number of attacks has doubled in five years, from 2093 cases in 2019, to 4054 in 2024.

One senior charge nurse in the East Midlands said: "Even patients you would expect to be placid are becoming irate because of just how long they have to wait. So, you can only imagine the behaviour of those who are already prone to violence." She herself has been punched in the face by a "drunken six-foot-two bloke."

A senior sister in an A&E in east London was knocked unconscious after being punched in the head by a patient. "The violence is awful," she said. "And it's just constant. Nurses, doctors, receptionists – none of us feels safe."

Another nurse said: "It's not going to help with our retention and recruitment if you think you're going to be clobbered every shift."

The RCN warns that such attacks lead to both physical and mental scarring, lengthy time off and sometimes staff never returning.

We remember in our prayers our parishioners who work in the NHS.



116 bundles were given locally during July and August.


Condolences

As you tidy your garden for winter.....

Gardens are preparing to go to sleep, but next Spring will soon be here. So why not consider some changes now:

- ~ Install a water butt now, to store up the winter rain for the Spring.
- \sim Reduce the hard standing in your garden. Instead, let rain soak into the soil, rather than go down a drain.
- \sim Plant something tall to create shade in your garden next year the soil will remain wetter.
- ~ Put in more plants the more you have, the more protection they give the ground. Try to use native species, as your local wildlife depends on them.~ Consider adding a pond it will be a great boost to your local wildlife!

Your Favourite Recipe

Christine Evans shares her mum's boiled cake recipe this month.

'Mum used to make these regularly for every cake stall or tea. I miss having one to take home! I hope this will inspire me to make my own!!'





Ingredients:

½ pint water and brandy

12 ounces mixed fruit

4 ounces margarine

½ teaspoon spice (optional)

2 eggs

12 ounces SR flour

8 ounces brown sugar

1/4 teaspoon bicarb

pinch of salt Glacé cherries (optional)

Method:

- 1. Place margarine in a large bowl
- 2. Boil the fruit and sugar with the brandy and water
- 3. Pour the boiled mixture over the margarine and stir
- 4. Leave to cool
- 5. Add the eggs and then the dried ingredients, and mix well
- 6. Share between 2 x 1lb tins, or use a 2lb tin or 7inch round tin (lined with parchment paper)
- 7. Cut some cherries in half and dip the middle edge of each into a tiny bit of flour (optional)
- 8. Place cherries down the middle of the cake mixture
- 9. Bake at $150/160^{\circ}$ gas mark 3
- 10. After 45-50 minutes cover the cakes with foil and return to the oven
- 11. Check if they are ready after a total cooking time of $1\frac{1}{4}$ $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours
- 12. Allow to cool and then enjoy with a nice cup of tea!!

KIDWELLY SENIOR CITIZENS



CURSILLO

Say CUR SEE O (Spanish). What is it? The answer is a movement of the Anglican Church, sanctioned by the Bishop of the Diocese or it cannot exist.

Are there members of Cursillo here is Kidwelly? Yes, there are five in St. Mary's Church and a former vicar, the Revd. Hugh James is also a member. Cursillo is not something weird and wonderful as some people think: it is just wonderful!

How do you become a member? A Cursillista (Spanish again!). You have to be at least eighteen and a member of the Anglican church. If interested, you go on a short residential course in Christian living and explore your faith. Afterwards, you don't forget about it but try to be as active a Christian as you are able in your own community. You are not on your own. It is a very supportive movement and Cursillistas in the diocese gather several times a year in various places for a meeting call an Ultreya. Again this is a Spanish word meaning Onward! It is the call to boost spirits of pilgrims as they journey.

Why all this introduction and talk of Ultreya? It is because there is a huge National Ultreya each year at the beginning of September. This year it was in Durham and three Cursillistas went from St. Mary's. Although we went from Friday to Monday, the Ultreya was on the Saturday.

Cursillistas from England, Wales and Scotland met in a hall in the morning. Goody bags were provided, bottles of water, tea, coffee and biscuits so we could mingle and chat. We linked up with another from our diocese and two from Swansea and Brecon. After hymn singing and an introduction from the Durham hosts, we broke into small groups, finding people we did not already know, and discussed the three principles of Cursillo: Prayer, Study and Action and how we had been recently trying to carry them out. There was also a keynote speaker and other information.

After lunch, everyone met with their Cursillo banners on a green near the cathedral and paraded around the green and into the cathedral. There were many tourists to see this Walk of Witness and read on the banners where these people had come from.

The Eucharist was hosted by the Durham Anglican Cursillo and the Right Reverend Sarah Clark, Bishop of Jarrow and acting Bishop of Durham,

St. Luke October 18th

As we remember St Luke this month, let's note that one of the major themes in his gospel is prayer. Jesus tells the *Parable of the Friend at Midnight* (Luke 11:5-8) in the context of teaching His disciples to pray.

Pray Shamelessly:

In the parable a man approaches his friend at midnight and asking: 'Friend, lend me three loaves, for a friend of mine has arrived on a journey, and I have nothing to set before him' (5-6). Despite the hour, the rules of hospitality mean that this is not an unreasonable request. Jesus says, 'though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, yet because of the man's boldness he will rise and give him whatever he needs' (8). Jesus is telling us to approach our heavenly Father in 'shameless boldness' with our needs. As adopted children we should have no hesitancy in coming to talk with our Father. It is not God who is reluctant to answer, but we to ask. Do we pray with shameless boldness?

Pray Persistently:

Like children we should be persistent in our requests: 'Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.' (9). All three verbs indicate a continual habit: 'Keep on asking...seeking...knocking'. We will not be content simply to ask once and then move on. Jesus tells us to bring our prayers to God persistently. Do we give up too easily in prayer?

Pray Expectantly:

'For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened.'(10). Are we expectant in our prayers, believing that God delights in meeting our requests? Why not begin this adventure of prayer today!



Shine a little light this Hallowe'en

Some parents aren't sure quite what to feel about Hallowe'en – is it just harmless fun, or are there aspects of it that don't fit in with how we want to see the world?

A child's christening service is very honest about the reality of good and evil, and Hallowe'en can be a good time to talk about those things and how the love of Jesus can be a 'Light in the darkness' for everyone.

The word 'hallowe'en' actually means 'the eve of all hallows' day' – in other words, the night before the church's festival celebrating All Saints. A Saint is sometimes thought to be an exceptionally holy person – someone really special, who did extraordinary things because of their faith in God.

The famous saints are all amazing examples of what it's like to live God's way. But in the Bible, St Paul calls all Christians saints – a saint is simply a friend of God, who seeks to live their life according to God's purposes. When someone is christened, they truly become a Saint, so All Saints' Day is a celebration of the whole family of God.

If you'd like to mark Hallowe'en, these are some ideas that will bless others as well as being fun too.

What's happening in church? Some churches hold special events around this time of year. There might be a 'Light Party' with fun activities for children and young people – these events are a lovely way to focus on all that's life-giving and positive around All Hallows.

Some churches also have a special service for All Souls Day – a time when we remember our loved ones who have died. There might be an opportunity to go and light a candle to remember someone – even small children grieve in their own way and may find comfort in this simple action. Why not pop into your local church, or look up on their website, to find out what's happening in our local area?

Carve a pumpkin. Did you know that gargoyles (the scary looking faces carved in stone on churches) were originally made in medieval times to scare away evil spirits? The pumpkins with scary faces carved into them at Hallowe'en are a bit like that.

But Christians believe that you can't fight evil with evil – you can only fight evil with good, and that good will always win in the end. So why not see if you can carve a friendly looking pumpkin this year, as a sign that you and your family are going to be a force for good this Hallowe'en? (And you can always use the offcuts from your pumpkin to make delicious soup!)

You can do the same with Hallowe'en costumes. Superheroes make a great, positive alternative to scary witches and ghosts.

Give a treat. Not everyone is comfortable with the idea of children going round to neighbours' and just asking for treats. But if you don't want them to miss out on something their friends are doing, why not have a family baking session, and take a tray of cookies with you if you go out with them? Even little children can help stick a smiley face on an iced biscuit. That way, you have something lovely to give away to your neighbours, too!

Safety first. Many children's fancy dress costumes are highly flammable. Please, don't ever use real candles around your front door or in your pumpkins; use the small battery-powered candles instead. If you can afford to buy a multi-pack of these electric candles, you could lend them to your friends and neighbours.

Say a goodnight prayer. Even if you've steered clear of scary costumes, and even if your child has loved the evening, it can be reassuring to have a goodnight prayer that reminds them that love, and light, and good, are always going to be stronger than fear and evil.

The ancient service of Compline (Night Prayer) has been used as this reminder for centuries, and many of its prayers are still well known today: 'Visit this place, O Lord, we pray and drive far from it all snares of the enemy; let Your holy angels dwell with us to preserve us in peace; and let Your blessing be upon us always, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.' Or, in a simpler children's version: 'Be with us, Lord, and take away all fear, may your angels protect us and give us peace. And bless us always. Amen.' You can use these lovely prayers any time when you need a reminder that God is with you – especially at the end of a difficult day, or when something sad has happened, or when your family is worried about something.



Complaints- how do you make them effective?

Editor: David Pickup, a solicitor, offers some general advice on what to do when you are not happy about something...

I cried unto the Lord with my voice;... I poured out my complaint before him; I shewed before Him my trouble. (Psalm 142:1,2 KJV)

Perhaps it is a British thing, but we do not like to complain, do we? But the psalmist was not British, so he did not mind complaining — even to God, we are told. Nowadays, most large organisations, especially public bodies, want us to complain if something is wrong, because good service standards are important. They have well designed complaints systems and independent ombudsmen to oversee it all.

The first thing is to try to resolve an issue informally. If this has not worked, use the proper procedure. You can probably find how to on the company's website.

Be precise about what you are complaining about. Be clear – use account numbers, references and dates. Put in the names of persons involved, if you know them. Do not leave it too long because most procedures have deadlines.

Keep it short, simple and to the point. Ask a friend to look at it first, to make sure they understand what you are complaining about. Be firm but polite and business-like – you are more likely to be listened to. It may be helpful to use numbered points, in date order. Keep a note of dates. Be reasonable. It may be an apology will suffice, but do not be fobbed off. Think about what outcome you want. Is it an apology? If so, get a genuine apology. If you are told "we are sorry you felt let down" that is not an apology; "We let you down" is. Perhaps you want the organisation to change their ways so something bad does not happen to other people.

And another thing: if you get a good service from someone, tell the company. It might make their day.
