### **Pastoral Letter**

Dear Friends,

After the joyous thanks and celebration of harvest, the month of November starts off with a rather sombre tone, we have All Saints Day and All Souls the day after, later in the month we have Remembrance Sunday as well. Three occasions when we look to remember those who have gone before us. Each event is different; All Saints is the day that we remember the saints and martyrs of the church, both well-known and known only to God. These are the people that have shaped and built our church over the centuries, they are the Saints Triumphant, to use a rather old name for them. They have lived and died (or been killed) in the faith of Christ and now they rest in the company of Heaven; All Souls is when we remember friends, relatives and loved ones who are no longer with us. We mourn their passing, but like the Saints we remember that there will come a time when we see them again; Remembrance Sunday is of course when we remember those who fought and died in the great war and conflicts since.

Sombre these three may be, but it is worth looking at them as a continuation of the season of harvest when we give thanks to God for what he has given us. The saints of the church should be remembered with thanks, because without their efforts the church would be very different today. These are the people that spread the faith, taught people about Christ and brought hope and comfort to many people. The work that many of them started continues today and the effect of their missions can still be felt across the globe.

With All Souls, we mourn the passing of our loved ones, some recently departed and some many years past. But despite our pain it reminds us to be thankful for all that they did for us, the example that they set us and the joy that times spent with them brought us. They may be gone, but they are not forgotten, and we can take comfort from the fact that they rest with God.

Remembrance Sunday gives us cause to be thankful for the sacrifices of those who have defended our nation and allows us to enjoy the freedoms that we now have.

Sombre these events may be, but perhaps we should look at them in a new light and whilst we will all have our own thoughts and emotions about them, we might want to remember to celebrate what all those we remember and commemorate at this time have done for us.




### Price changes

### Your Favourite Recipe

Jayne Roberts lent me a recipe book from Ysgol Nant-y-Groes which the children and parents contributed to, so with winter approaching I've chosen Cawl Cymru from this book. (I do notice a lack of potatoes and leeks which I put in mine when I make it!) (Editor)

### **Cawl Cymru**

2 lb. Welsh lamb

2 carrots

2 turnips

2 onions

1 oz. barley

4 pints of water

1 tsp mixed herbs

Salt and pepper



Method: Cut the meat in pieces and remove as much fat as possible. Cover with water in a large saucepan. Bring to the boil and skim. Peel and slice all the vegetables. Add all the ingredients to the meat. Season to taste. Simmer for 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  - 2 hrs. until meat is tender. Serve hot.



What started as a simple, compassionate idea has grown into one of the most enduring and impactful projects in our movement's history.



**And they Call it Poppy Love** – extract from an article in the British Legion magazine. Poppy Appeal:

More than 100 years after the Royal British Legion officially adopted the poppy as a symbol of Remembrance, the charity's annual Poppy Appeal is as important as ever. Each October and November, the nation comes together to recognise the historical and present-day sacrifices made by our Armed Forces around the world.


The Appeal is the UK's largest annual fundraising even, and the money raised plays an essential role in supporting the Armed Fores community and their families after just one day of service. In 2024 32 million poppies and 127,000 wreaths were distributed with an incredible £51.5 million raised altogether. Every penny matters — without these funds the RBL simply wouldn't be able to respond to the increasingly complex needs of its beneficiaries.

How last year's money was spent – In the past year alone, the RBL has responded to 128,268 requests for support from the Armed Forces community. RBL Admiral Nurses carried out around 135,000 interventions to support people living with a diagnosis of dementia. Almost £10 million was required to help Armed Forces families struggling with the ever-increasing cost of living. More than 22,000 veterans, serving personnel and their families received life-changing welfare support to cover essentials such as rent, utility bills and food.

More than 700 veterans and serving personnel received support from the RBL's Battle Back Centre in Shropshire, rebuilding themselves through sport and camaraderie. This is just a glimpse of what the RBL has been able to do with poppy appeal funds.

Our Poppy Appeal will be well under way by the time you get this magazine having started on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> October in the Co-op. Our poppy organisers, Janis and Ron Jones, do an incredible job, and this is their tenth year of co-ordinating the appeal. Last year, £10,377 was raised. Please support them again this year if you are able.

Assisted suicide law would make this a country that says 'some lives are not worth living' – Bishop of London

Parish Pump Editor: This is an issue which may affect all of us in the years to come, and so we have run this story long, to give you the full picture.

The Bishop of London has warned peers in the House of Lords that legalising assisted suicide in England and Wales will "change society" by endorsing the idea that "some lives are not worth living".

Bishop Sarah Mullally, the former Chief Nursing Officer for England, was concerned about those who could face internal and subtle pressures to end their lives if assisted suicide were introduced – particularly in the absence of adequate palliative or social care, or out of fear of becoming a burden on their families.

"I understand the fear of many that they may be offered free assisted death before they are offered the care and equipment that they may live," she said.

As the Church of England's lead bishop for health and social care, the Bishop of London was speaking as the House of Lords debated the Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill in late September.

The Private Member's Bill, brought by the MP Kim Leadbeater, completed its Third Reading in the Commons in June with a reduced majority of just 23 votes amid mounting concerns about its safety.

Bishop Sarah said it is right for peers now to scrutinise the Bill but argued that no amendments could ultimately make it entirely safe from the negative effects such as people being pressured to end their lives. "I am deeply concerned that so many in this Parliament are not heeding the voices of professional and representative bodies that are raising the alarm." She also rejected the central claim that the Bill would offer people choice at the end of their lives.

"A meaningful choice would see the measures in this Bill set alongside equally available, fully funded palliative and social care services," she said. "Without the choice offered this choice is an illusion." She spoke about her personal experience, including as a nurse, priest, and bishop, of spending time with people as they died and said the introduction of assisted dying within the health system would fundamentally alter the role of health professionals. "To change the law is to change society," she added. "If passed, this Bill will signal that we are a society that believes that some lives are not worth living. "This Bill would become our State-endorsed position, and our NHS would be active in its delivery. I believe in a God who's very being is life, and in that gift we can discover meaning, dignity and innate worth, even if we are dying".

Nevertheless, the assisted dying bill has passed its second reading in the House of Lords, moving it another step closer to becoming law. The Bill now goes to a select committee for further scrutiny, with a deadline of reporting back to the House of Lords by 7<sup>th</sup> November, before it can move to the next stage.

# Time to Remember the Persecuted Church – 2<sup>nd</sup> November

Have you ever felt frightened to go to church? Afraid that someone might see you and report you to the authorities?

380 million Christians around the world have that anxiety, because one in seven Christians worldwide live in countries with high levels of persecution. That includes one in five in Africa and one in seven in Asia. These Christians make up the Persecuted Church, and live with the threat of discrimination, violence, imprisonment, and even death.

To support these suffering Christians, The International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church (IDOP) is held each year in November. It is a good month to choose, because November is the month of remembrance – not only of our armed forces on Remembrance Sunday, but also of all Christian saints and martyrs who have given their lives for Christ, on All Saints Day and All Souls Day.

And so, on 2<sup>nd</sup> November thousands of Christians in churches across the UK will pray for the Persecuted Church worldwide. They will also send practical help through supporting well-established UK organisations such as Open Doors, Release International and Christian Solidarity Worldwide. These work to advocate for persecuted Christians in the UN and to advocate with national governments. They also distribute humanitarian aid to the affected communities around the world.

If you would like to join in this year, Open Doors, Release International, Christian Solidarity Worldwide (CSW), and International Christian Concern offer you digital resource packs containing prayer guides, information about specific regions of persecution, and materials for church services, home groups, and children's activities. Meanwhile, here are some things to consider (figures from Open Doors): Worldwide, at least 4,476 Christians were killed last year for their faith. Nigeria alone accounted for 3,100 of them. Other countries in sub-Saharan Africa have seen rising numbers of Christian deaths.

Worldwide, at least 4,744 Christians were detained. They were arrested and detained without trial. Some were then sentenced and imprisoned for following Jesus. In India alone, 1,629 Christians were detained without trial and another 547 were sentenced to prison. Believers were incarcerated for their faith in Eritrea, Bangladesh, Iran amongst others. Worldwide, at least 210,000 Christians were driven from their homes last year and forced into hiding. Again, almost half of these were in Nigeria, where militant Islamism is on the rise.

As for individual countries, in Algeria alone last year, *all* the Protestant churches were ordered to close, or were forced to stop regular services. In Mexico, where organised crime is rampant, any Christians who protest at the violence become themselves a target for abduction and murder. In Kyrgyzstan, violence against Christians is also on the rise, as the authoritarian government further represses religious freedom.
